I have changed the text a bit, to make it 'fit' in the woman's mouth, and to give the impression that she could be speaking of her own life, perhaps of an impending divorce.

Now numbering nearly 18,000, Japanese immigrants and their children have made a home for themselves in this country that, in the words of one Japanese-Argentine poetess, "welcomed us with yellow flowers like a rain of gold." Japan Across The Seas paints a complex and multifaceted portrait of the diversity of the Japanese-Argentine experience.

The film travels not only to archaeological sites in Argentina, Paraguay and Brazil, but to the jungle where the Guaranís survive in small communities. The modern reality of The Guarani contrasts sharply with their history of splendour, utopias, contradictions, successes, and failures.

In Nahá, a village located in the forest of Chiapas in Mexico, the development of local tourism is promoted among the 200 Maya-Lacandóns. A government representative invites the women of the community to a workshop demonstrating the importance of their culture and traditions for developing ethnic tourism. But as the government's vision is explained, we realize that the young women find themselves in an ambiguous situation, caught between tradition and modernity. The future of tourism in the community ostensibly rests on the choices they will make. The presence of the three directors – also tourists – offers a counterpart to the institutional discourse by drawing attention to their relationship with their hostesses.

Remixing public domain archival footage of Coney Island and early vaudeville performers from the Prelinger and American Memory Archives, freak girls is a tribute, both playful and haunting, to some of the women who pioneered the art of the female spectacle.

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
